

How to report crime and anti-social behaviour:

- If it's not an emergency, or to report a crime which has already taken place – eg if your car has been stolen – call **0300 123 1212**
- If you are concerned about crime or anti-social behaviour in your local neighbourhood, call Tollington SNT on **020 7421 0559**
- You can call Crimestoppers anonymously on **0800 555 111**
- You can also report non-urgent and hate crime incidents online at **www.online.met.police.uk**
- If you are a *Homes for Islington* (HFI) tenant, you can use the 'Looking Local' service, which allows Sky or Virgin Media subscribers to report anti-social behaviour through their TV, using their remote control. You can also call HFI's anti social behaviour hotline on **020 7527 7272**
- In an emergency, or if a crime is taking place, always dial **999**

Drug dealing

Tollington Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT) has successfully made several arrests and drugs raids, after receiving information from the local community.

SNT patrols have resulted in the arrest of three men, who have all since been charged with possession of Class A drugs with intent to supply.

A number of properties have been searched for drugs, following information supplied by local residents. Two of these raids have resulted in charges of possession, with a further two resulting in charges of intent to supply drugs.

You told us you were concerned about drug dealing in and around Stroud Green Road. Police carried out an undercover operation targeting drug dealers, and arrested and charged four people who are now awaiting trial. As a result the area, particularly around Tesco, has greatly improved.

You also raised concerns about an address in Hornsey Road. The premises were raided and crack cocaine and drug-related equipment found. A man was arrested for possession of Class A drugs.

Waste ground in Hatchard Road

Tollington SNT received a number of complaints from residents in Hatchard Road, who were concerned about an area of waste ground next to an electricity sub station. The area had become a haven for drug users and fly-tippers, and the rubbish was building up. Working with the owner of the land, the area has now been cleared and a new secure gate has been fitted.

Community Payback

Community Payback is a community service programme for offenders, run by Islington Council in partnership with London Probation, and Safer Neighbourhoods Teams. All offenders are supervised by London Probation. The scheme provides offenders with essential life skills, and is aimed at preventing them from becoming involved in further offences. Islington Council is always looking for future projects for the Community Payback programme – it could be anything from community gardening to painting or cleaning up a playground. Work that needs doing quickly may not always be appropriate for Community Payback as projects are booked in months in advance.

Want to have your say on local policing?

Do you live or work in the Tollington ward? This is your chance to have a say on local policing. Tollington SNT is currently looking for residents to join the ward panel. The panel meets every eight – 12 weeks to discuss local issues. The panel is responsible for setting the policing priorities in the ward and helping to plan the police response to local problems.

Are you up for the challenge?

January saw the start of the first ever Safer Neighbourhoods Annual Challenge (SNAC) in Islington.

Tollington SNT wants young people to think about what they can do to make the neighbourhood safer and what activities they can organise to address local problems.

A few ideas include organising a bicycle marking scheme, designing a SNAC website, arranging graffiti removal, or setting up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme. Your local SNT or Safer Schools officer can help with organising and securing funding for the project.

The SNAC runs over spring term, and is for young people aged five – 19 who attend a primary or secondary school, college or youth club in the area.
